

Vermont Bald Eagle Restoration Initiative Talk Planned

Vermont is the only state of the contiguous 48 states that doesn't have a population of breeding bald eagles, and a group of agencies decided to do something about it. The U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, the National Wildlife Federation, the Vermont Department of Fish & Wildlife, Central Vermont Public Service, and Outreach for Earth Stewardship have all joined together to build a Vermont population of breeding bald eagles. The effort has just completed its second season.

On Wednesday, Nov. 16, at 6:30 p.m. in the Nella Grimm Fox Room of the Rutland Free Library, Rutland County Audubon will present Eveleen Cecchini, founding director of Outreach for Earth Stewardship, who will present a program detailing the status of the bald eagle project so far and describing her organization's role in the project.
